REVIVAL'S COVENANT

Fact — God is more willing to give us revival than we are wanting to be revived!

Probably the most well-known and oftenquoted promise of revival is 2 Chronicles 7:14: "If my people who are called by my name will humble themselves, and pray and seek my face, and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin and heal their land."

Let us accept our God's holy challenge here.

- 1. HUMBLE YOURSELF ... the text tells us how.
- 2. PRAY AND SEEK HIS FACE. Study the history of God's work on earth = revival, and we will always find faithful praying saints, often hidden, holding on before him in prayer, pleading for him to revive his people.

To be sure, God requires more than casual prayers for revival. He wants us to hunger and thirst for revival! To seek God's face is far more than occasionally mentioning "revival" in our prayer. It involves repeated and prolonged prayer, agonizing prayer. It requires holy determination in prayer, examining ourselves to see if anything in our lives is hindering God.

Are you seeking God's face?

3. REPENT AND RETURN. Repentance is a twofold turn — from sin/sinful living ... anything that grieves God, whether things we did or things we failed to do, to a fullhearted service to God (Acts 26:18, 20).

Be quick to repent! This is what prepares the way for revival ... "**Repent therefore and be converted, that your sins may be blotted out, so that times of refreshing may come from the presence of the Lord**" (Acts 3:19).

There you have it, three essential steps in preparing the way of the Lord for revival. These are God's covenantal conditions if we would see his mighty working. When we fulfill his clear conditions, God will do two things: forgive us and give gracious healing to our land. Revival always brings healing to homes, churches, communities, and nations. "Oh God, heal Pennsylvania!" — should be our heart-cry! If we will fulfill God's covenantal conditions, we will see God's covenantal promises fulfilled. So the question isn't, "Will revival come?" but rather "Will we meet God's covenantal conditions for revival?" YES!

Their needs become our needs, their burdens become our burdens, their challenges, our challenges and their victories, our victories! We have "skin in the game." Our combined prayer unites us! We all know the example of the 3-strand cord, when woven together it becomes much stronger than individually. Not only is this cord now stronger, but more useful because of the strength thereof. A strong body of united, praying, Apostolics becomes a strong tool that is ushering the revival we seek in Pennsylvania! 
