We badly need to recover this spiritual discipline among ourselves ... talking about what God is doing and showing us through his Word, not only in our local assemblies, but throughout our section, state, and world! INCONVENIENCE VS. SACRIFICE

You've probably heard the story about the chicken and the pig who wanted to open a restaurant. They were going to feature a daily breakfast; so, the chicken announced, "I will provide the eggs, and you, Pig, can provide the bacon." That's a pretty convenient decision for the chicken to make! In Africa, as you can well imagine, convenience is not common, but inconvenience does not necessarily

equal sacrifice either. This very thought was hammered home for us as we traveled to the capital city of Malawi, Lilongwe, for Easter. A five hour trip from where we live. As we approached the city, we came across a four-lane highway torn up from construction; it was nothing but complete dirt for miles and miles. On the roads that were paved, we spent our drive swerving back and forth to miss pothole after pothole—they were large enough to swallow your car! After arriving, we went to get a bite to eat ... there were so many roads closed that the GPS could not get us to the restaurant or back to the hotel. We were lost! We didn't expect this, especially since it's the



capital city, not some remote village. Needless to say, I was very frustrated, and in that moment I even told Sister Betterley that I didn't care if we ever came back to Lilongwe again! Eventually, we found our way back to the comfort of our hotel. On Sunday, we went to one of the most remote churches in Malawi and had an incredible Easter Service! The Pastor in that village has started eleven

daughter works, four of which are in the neighboring country of Mozambique; his current congregation is three times the size of his building! With the number of people in attendance, we held the service outside, and afterwards, we found out that a group of over 25 people had walked from Mozambique to be in service with us! This was a 14-hour journey on foot! In that moment, I realized *I was the chicken, not the pig*! Driving on terrible roads, swerving to miss potholes, and getting lost in a foreign city—it was all an inconvenience, but inconvenience doesn't always equal sacrifice. **Do we really know what sacrifice is**?



ALLENTOWN

Several years ago, God began speaking to me about church planting. I was burdened by the flyer put out at 2018 Fall PA District Conference — county map of Pennsylvania illustrating the 36 counties without a United Pentecostal Church ... 3,211,151 souls! One of those counties, Lehigh County, always stood out to me. Lehigh County is home to Allentown, the third largest city in PA, and one of the fastest growing. Indeed, Allentown had been on our hearts for many years, always wondering why there was no church, and when *someone* would go.


We took this burden with us as God moved us out of PA in the summer of 2019, for a season, to live and minister in New Brunswick, Canada. We didn't know what awaited us; only that we were following the leading of the Holy Ghost. Six months later, COVID ... the world shut down, the border closed. Family and friends couldn't visit. Even neighbors couldn't congregate. There we were, in a new place, knowing precious few people, all alone. Little did we know that this was the hand of God preparing us for the next season of our lives and ministry. It was during this time that we learned to stand together as a family; we learned what it was to live for God even when no one is watching, even when the church building sits empty, dark, and cold, even when it seems like the world is crumbling around you. This season galvanized our dedication, and our resolve to do the work of God, no matter what!

Not quite two years later, God began signaling to us that it was time to move. Our temporary Canadian residency was coming to an end, and God began swinging doors wide open for us to return to the US. As we sought the Lord for our next assignment, He spoke clearly to us, leading us to pursue Allentown. Much prayer went up, phone calls were made, and the PA District Board agreed with us in the Holy Ghost that Allentown was to be where God would have us plant a church. In the summer of 2021, we relocated to Allentown to begin planting Foundation Church. The Lord enabled us to quickly find a home, and we held our first Wednesday night small group there in April 2022. We followed this up with our first Sunday morning service on September 11, 2022 — in our living room. We later moved into a room on the campus of Cedar Crest College in October, and have been having Sunday services there ever since. This space has

been such an incredible blessing to us, at a fraction of the cost of any other space rental in the greater Allentown area! Since beginning, we have baptized 11 in Jesus' name, we have seen the Holy Ghost poured out, and God doing a deep work in the many people He has brought to us! We have a thriving Sunday school, now with their own dedicated classrooms on campus. We also currently hold bimonthly bilingual services (English/Spanish) as this is a huge need in our area. God is on the move here, and continues to do tremendous things! Obviously, we could have never done this on our own. We held monthly "Valley Connect" Community Worship Nights from October 2022 through August 2023, culminating in our SOAR Outreach event in September 2023. At each event, we had worship teams from all over Section 1/PA District come and lend us their musical talent, anointed worship, and manpower; many showed up just to support us, worship, and pray for those in attendance. THANK YOU to all our area Pastors and churches! We continue to press forward in 2024, watching God move in the lives and hearts of Foundation Church.

We still have need of laborers in many areas, but know that God is faithful, and He will provide! Pray that the Lord of the harvest will send forth laborers, and pray that God would continue to bring revival to Allentown and the Lehigh Valley!





BEGIN WITH THE END IN MIND

During the summer of 2020, while inspecting the church roof for leaks, I discovered significant issues with the ridge board, rafters, and ceiling joists, causing severe bowing. This posed a major safety concern for all occupants. After involving the insurance company, a Structural Engineer assessed this situation, concluding that the entire roof needed replacement or repair. I was confident that the repairs would be covered by the church's insurance policy. Unfortunately, the insurance didn't cover the costs, leaving us facing an unexpected expense of \$150K. Despite

financial strain, and the challenges of a COVID-19 outbreak and declining church membership, we held onto our faith in God's providence. Seeking alternative quotes, the lowest offered was \$130K — beyond our church's means. While contemplating the closure of the physical building, we resolved to keep the spiritual doors open. Additionally, in seeking the Lord regarding the 2022 Christmas for Christ offering, my wife and I felt impressed by the Lord for our church to give \$20K to this offering. With a dwindling congregation of

20-25 members, including children and a deadline of October 31, 2023, to complete the roof repairs, the church gave \$19K to CFC offering. Praise the Lord! In March 2023, a prophetic message of God's abundance blessings at a mentorship conference uplifted my spirit, despite slow progress. In August, unexpectedly, Brother Michael Wright, PA NAM Director, reached out, expressing divine guidance to address our building needs. Through collaborative efforts and adherence to code regulations, the project was miraculously completed on October 27th, at a fraction of the original cost, totaling only **\$600**. To God be the glory!
