REVIVAL OF OUR HOMES

I write this knowing full well that everybody's individual circumstances are different; and so, I am not criticizing nor am I suggesting that this is *the only way* that revival will occur. I simply want to bring an awareness and alertness to what is actually happening in our culture, especially in the Western world, and what Christianity might look like in our children's lifetimes if we do not make changes in our mindsets.

Statistically, the United States population in 1975 was around 240 million people with 91% confessing themselves to be "Christian." In 2025, with the U.S. population estimated to be 335 million, only 60% identify as Christian, marking a decrease of 31% in the last 50 years. Comparatively, the Jewish faith in the United States between 1975-2025, saw an increase of 25% to 33%. The Muslim faith in America has seen the most growth in the last 50 years – 285.7% increase! Christians are in the decline! Further, the CDC in July 2025 noted that the average birth rate for Americans is 1.6 per woman, meaning couples are not even having enough children to replace themselves! All the while, the numbers are doubled or even higher in the Jewish and Muslim communities. Of these three major religions, Christianity relies the most on the conversion of non-Christians, and I would venture to say that within the Pentecostal/Apostolic movement, that number would be even higher. The Muslim and Jewish faiths rely much lower on conversion rates. And yet, in the last 50 years, Judaism and Islam have increased while Christianity has decreased in the United States.

I believe, and unashamedly declare, that there will be and needs to be an unprecedented Apostolic revival in every age group, age, and color! It will happen because God's Spirit will be poured out on all flesh! However, I think it responsible to stop and ask ourselves, Why would God give us more if we're not taking care of or realizing the weight of the responsibility and the power that we have within the family unit itself? Unfortunately, a generation of Christians has been duped into glorifying and believing that door-knocking and Bible study are somehow more important in God's eyes than fathering or mothering their

children. As if somehow, as long as you're giving to others while your children starve, God will bless you. That's a clear contradiction to the biblical stewardship principle.

I personally know and have been blessed by those in the kingdom of God who have a higher than average number of children — today their families are affecting the church in a powerful way! And as those children grow up and get married and have their own children, that church can have upwards of twenty to thirty people in their assembly just within one generation! The contrast is also true for those who glorify "door-knocking" and other evangelistic outreaches and ministries — it's needed! But not at the cost of "child sacrifice," above the responsibility of caring for the Lord's heritage. I believe Abraham would have traded in all his other promises for Isaac because he would have known that in Isaac is the promise. Yet in today's culture, society would like to pressure us into trading in our "Isaac" = the Lord's promises and the Lord's heritage, for other temporal blessings, material wealth, or status ... for the temporary at the expense of the eternal. My heart aches; we are wanting God to give us "other children" instead of working with "our children" now and perpetuate the generations of the kingdom of God in our life.

I heard recently that the average age within Oneness organizations is over 55; the average age of the church planter is 49.5! With an aging church population and a culture moving away from God, who are we "planting" these churches for? This is a very serious question to ask ourselves — especially if we are not imparting the faith, hope, and belief in God's revival with the stewardship responsibility of raising the righteous generations of the children of the Lord in the fear of the Lord. Sacrifice is necessary, but that's a small price to pay for God's heritage to have an opportunity to be established in our homes. The church needs to be more aware than ever that if we send our children to Rome, we shouldn't be surprised if they come back as Romans. There is no higher calling that that of Fatherhood and motherhood! Nothing else makes a bigger impact on eternity. My heart cries out to my generation to, yes, believe and pray for Apostolic revival, but do not neglect our homes, our spouses, nor the Lord's heritage.

Actually, that's where it will start!



WE CAN'T MESS IT UP!

God's ultimate purpose in redemption is not the cross or the gospel or the gift of the Holy Spirit; these are the means to an end. But the end is to obtain for Himself a glorious church for eternity — His bride, His family, His own special people. The writer of Hebrews speaks of this purpose when he writes of God's intention to bring "many sons to glory" (Hebrews 2:10). To accomplish this, God made Adam and Eve and crowned them with glory and honor. Adam and Eve were then to bring forth children who in turn would produce children until the world was filled with glorious children.



Due to the intrusion of sin, Adam and Eve failed to fulfill God's plan, being stripped of God's glory and sent into a world filled with corruption. God then came into His world through the birth process and established the church, also known as the bride of Christ. Just as Eve came out of Adam's side while he slept, so the church comes out of the blood and water that gushed from the side of Jesus as He "slept" on the cross. As the new Adam, Jesus is the father, and as the new Eve, the church the mother. Together they bring forth spiritual children through the New Birth of water and Spirit. God's plan continues to be to establish a glorious family for eternity by bringing many sons to glory.

We sometimes look at ourselves and wonder why God chose us to be the new Eve. Certainly we are as flawed and as subject to temptation as the original Eve. But consider this: who sinned first, Adam or Eve? It was Eve. She ate and then gave to Adam and he ate (Genesis 3:6). Yet Romans 5:12 says that "by one man sin came into the world." This is because Adam was the head of Eve. She had come from him, and he was responsible for her conduct.

As her head, Adam had a mediatorial responsibility for Eve. He was told to "work" and "guard" the garden: priestly terms that are also applied to the men who served in God's temple. That fact is, Eve did not have the power on her own to destroy God's plan. She did not even have the power to bring sin into the world. Had Adam done his work as her head, he would have dealt with Eve's transgression redemptively, acting as her advocate before God. He would have assumed his role as the priest of his home, working to reconcile her to God, so that the plan of God could continue toward fulfillment. But instead of doing his work as a mediator, Adam sinned too, and it was by his sin that the plan stalled.

We are Eve. Like her, we are weak, vulnerable, and prone to sin. We are easily tempted and easily deceived. Though our spirit may be willing, our flesh is weak. But be it known that our failures cannot stop God's plan, because we have a head who will do His work. He will propitiate our sins and not participate in them. Regardless of what we do or fail to do, as long as we confess our sins, He will be the faithful and just mediator between us and our God.

It is not our sins, or our failures, or our inconsistencies that can stop God's plan for acquiring a spiritual family. We do not have the power to stop it by our misconduct. In other words, we don't have to do everything perfectly for His plan to succeed. The only thing we can do to disrupt it is to fail to submit to our Husband and refuse to be intimate with Him. It is close interconnection with Jesus that results in reproduction, and only abstinence from Him can cause reproduction to cease. And that would stall the plan.
